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Day 1: The Blessing Begins With Love

Could one simple command from Jesus unlock greater peace, faith and victory in your life? On this episode of *Believer's Voice of Victory*, Kenneth Copeland and John Copeland reveal why walking in love is more than a suggestion; it's a key to living in The Blessing. Discover how God's love affects your faith, your relationships, and even the words you speak every day. If you've ever struggled with offense, criticism or unforgiveness, this encouraging message will show you a better way forward.

Introduction

Kenneth Copeland welcomes his son, John Copeland, to discuss how THE BLESSING of God moves you to walk in Love, increases your Faith and gives pleasure to generosity as you share the good news of Jesus Christ.

Study It

- I. God's commandment of Love is the foundation of victorious living.
 - Jesus said to love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself.
 - Walking in Love is not optional for the believer. It is the way Faith operates and grows.
 - Faith works by Love (Galatians 5:6).
 - When believers choose Love over offense, criticism and unforgiveness, they position themselves to receive and walk in THE BLESSING.
- II. The words you speak reveal what is in your heart.
 - Love affects the way you talk to and about people.
 - Speaking words of Faith and encouragement releases life.
 - Speaking criticism, strife and offense hinders Faith and fellowship.
 - The believer's voice should be a voice of victory.
- III. THE BLESSING is designed to flow through relationships.
 - God's Love equips believers to serve others.
 - Walking in Love strengthens families, friendships and ministry partnerships.
 - The Love of God enables believers to forgive quickly and move forward in Faith.

- IV. Living in Love positions you to walk in God's best.
- Love keeps your heart open to receive from God.
 - Love protects relationships and strengthens your witness.
 - Every believer can choose to walk in Love regardless of circumstances.

Make It Personal

Ask yourself:

Is there anyone I need to forgive? Are there words I need to change? Am I allowing God's Love to govern my responses?

Pray with us:

Heavenly Father, thank You for loving me. Help me walk in Love every day. I choose to forgive others, guard my words and allow Your Love to direct my life. Thank You for helping me grow in Faith and walk in THE BLESSING. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

Day 2: The Blessing Empowers Kingdom Purpose

What can God do through a life that is fully available to Him? Join Kenneth Copeland and John Copeland on *Believer's Voice of Victory* as they share how The Blessing is designed to do more than meet personal needs; it empowers believers to make an eternal impact. Through inspiring stories and biblical insight, you'll see how partnership, faith and obedience can expand your influence far beyond what you thought possible. Learn why God's provision always has a greater purpose attached to it.

Study It

- I. The purpose of THE BLESSING is to advance the kingdom of God.
 - The LORD spoke to Brother Copeland: "Every believer has a voice, and it is the voice of victory."
 - THE BLESSING is more than personal prosperity. It empowers believers to reach others with the gospel.
 - Since 1984, Kenneth Copeland Ministries and its Partners have helped reach millions of people with the message of Jesus Christ.
 - God's provision always carries kingdom purpose.
- II. Partnership is a covenant relationship.
 - "How shall they hear without a preacher?" (Romans 10:14).
 - God uses people working together to accomplish His purposes.
 - Kenneth Copeland Ministries is expanding because faithful Partners have joined their Faith, prayers and resources together.
 - Partnership is not merely financial support. It is agreement in prayer, faith and purpose.
 - Partners share in the eternal rewards of every life reached through the ministry.
- III. God provides tools to accomplish His assignments.
 - Brother Copeland learned to fly before entering ministry.
 - Airplanes became tools to carry the gospel around the world.
 - Every resource God provides should be viewed as a tool to fulfill His purpose.
 - The question is not what we possess, but how it is being used for the Kingdom.
- IV. Covenant relationships produce Kingdom increase.
 - Ephesians 4:16 describes the Body of Christ joined together and supplied by every part.
 - The LORD showed Brother Copeland that one million Partners would be like one million joints working together in the Body of Christ.
 - Every believer has a place and purpose in God's plan.
- V. God's WORD is the source of increase.
 - Oral Roberts instructed Brother Copeland to write Partner Letters as a teaching to help his Partners grow in The LORD.

- Ministry should never be driven by pressure but by obedience to God.
- Philippians is a powerful example of partnership in the New Testament.
- God supplies all our need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19).

VI. THE BLESSING flows through godly leadership and families.

- Men are called to lead with strength, Love and compassion.
- Godly leadership protects and strengthens families.
- Strong faith-filled homes help establish future generations in God's ways.

Make It Personal

Consider the ways God has BLESSED your life. Pray for guidance to find your next step to fulfill your calling in Christ.

Write down how you can use your resources, talents and opportunities to advance His kingdom and help others.

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Day 3: The Blessing Flows Through Covenant

Have you ever wondered just how committed God is to His promises? On this episode of *Believer's Voice of Victory*, Kenneth Copeland and John Copeland explore the life-changing power of covenant and what it means for believers today. You'll discover how God's covenant with Abraham points directly to His faithfulness in your own life and how you can experience The Blessing. Be inspired by a powerful reminder that God's love, commitment and promises are stronger than any circumstance you may face.

Study It

- I. God established His Covenant with Abraham.
 - God appeared to Abram and said, "I am El Shaddai, the Almighty God" (Genesis 17:1).
 - *El Shaddai* means "the God who is more than enough."
 - God changed Abram's name to Abraham and established a Covenant that would affect generations who kept His commandments.
 - God promised to multiply Abraham exceedingly (Genesis 17:2-6).
- II. Covenant is built on God's commitment, not man's ability.
 - God's promises are backed by His own integrity.
 - Covenant gives believers confidence in God's faithfulness.
 - What God promises, He is able to perform.
- III. Believers are connected to Abraham's Covenant through Jesus.
 - God's Covenant points directly to the redemption available through Christ.
 - Through Jesus, believers receive the promises of God.
 - THE BLESSING of Abraham belongs to those who believe.
- IV. Pray for the peace of Jerusalem.
 - Scripture instructs believers to pray for the peace of Jerusalem (Psalm 122:6).
 - God's heart remains toward His covenant people.
 - The land of Israel remains significant in God's covenant plan.
- V. Jesus secured a better Covenant.
 - Jesus taught His disciples to ask the Father in His Name (John 16:23).
 - Through Jesus, believers have direct access to the Father.
 - Jesus prayed that believers would be one as He and the Father are one (John 17:21).
 - Jesus prayed that the Father's Love for believers would be revealed (John 17:23).
 - Brother Copeland received a life-changing revelation that God loves him just as much as He loves Jesus.
 - God's Love is constant and unchanging.
 - Nothing can make God love you more, and nothing can make Him love you less.

Make It Personal

Take time to read John 17 and meditate on Jesus' prayer for you as a believer.

Write down what it means to you personally that God loves you as much as He loves Jesus, and that you are in Covenant with Him through His Son, Jesus.

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Day 4: The Blessing Comes Through God's Word

Could the answers you've been seeking already be waiting for you in God's Word? On *Believer's Voice of Victory*, Kenneth Copeland and John Copeland reveal how spending time in Scripture can transform the way you think, speak and live. Learn why guarding your heart and filling it with God's promises is essential to experiencing The Blessing. This Faith-building message will encourage you to make God's Word your first response to every challenge.

Study It

- I. God's Word produces life and health.
 - "My son, attend to my words" (Proverbs 4:20).
 - Spend time in God's Word every day.
 - Keep God's promises before your eyes and in your heart.
 - God's Word is life to those who find it and health to all their flesh (Proverbs 4:22).
- II. Guard your heart diligently.
 - Out of the heart flow the forces of life (Proverbs 4:23).
 - What enters your heart affects your Faith, words and actions.
 - Guard against false, dishonest and destructive speech.
 - Your words can either strengthen or hinder your walk with God.
- III. Spiritual growth requires continual feeding on God's WORD.
 - Desire the pure milk of God's WORD (1 Peter 2:2).
 - Believers are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood and a holy nation (1 Peter 2:9).
 - Spiritual maturity develops through consistent fellowship with God's WORD.
- IV. Healing and redemption belong to the believer.
 - Jesus bore our sins in His own body on the tree.
 - "By whose stripes ye were healed" (1 Peter 2:24).
 - Healing is part of redemption.
 - Believers receive God's promises by Faith.
- V. The Apostle Paul received revelation directly from Jesus.
 - Paul learned the gospel through revelation.
 - He saw truths concerning redemption, resurrection and the New Covenant.
 - Paul emphasized the victory believers have through Jesus Christ.
 - God gives us victory through our LORD Jesus Christ.
 - Death has lost its sting because of Christ's victory (1 Corinthians 15:55-57).
 - Believers are to remain steadfast, immovable and always abounding in the work of The LORD (1 Corinthians 15:58).
 - Our labor in The LORD is never in vain.

- VI. Angels minister on behalf of believers.
- Angels are ministering spirits sent forth to minister for those who inherit salvation (Hebrews 1:14).
 - Believers can confidently trust God's protection.
 - Brother Copeland regularly prays protection scriptures over every trip, assignment and Partner.

Make It Personal

God's WORD will produce life and health in your spirit, soul and body. What you think and say is important. Don't let your thoughts reflect how you feel. Choose to think what God says in His WORD about you.

Pray with us:

Father, I choose to attend to Your WORD. Help me guard my heart and fill it with Your promises. I receive Your healing, protection and wisdom. Thank You that Your WORD is life to me and health to all my flesh. I will stand firm in Faith and continue growing in You. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

Day 5: The Blessing Enables Generous Living

What if generosity is the doorway to a greater level of The Blessing in your life? On *Believer's Voice of Victory*, Kenneth Copeland, Kellie Copeland and John Copeland share how the tithing covenant opens the door to a lifestyle of faith-filled generosity. Through biblical examples and inspiring testimonies, you'll discover how giving is about much more than finances; it's about partnering with God's heart for people. Find out how living generously positions you to receive and share God's abundant provision.

Study It

- I. God's vision is always bigger than we can see.
 - Brother Copeland reiterates the ministry's original assignment and the millions of lives impacted through the preaching of the gospel.
 - More than 161 million salvations have been reported through ministry outreaches and partnerships.
 - The vision continues to expand through the development of Copeland University.
 - God often prepares people and places long before believers understand His complete plan.
 - Obedience today can affect future generations.
- II. Faith is connected to expectation.
 - Paul wrote of his "earnest expectation and hope" (Philippians 1:20).
 - Faith is the substance of things hoped for.
 - Biblical hope is not uncertainty—it is confident expectation.
 - Christ should be magnified and glorified in the lives of believers.
 - Faith expects God to fulfill His promises.
- III. Believers do not fear death.
 - Paul declared, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21).
 - Believers do not die; they depart to be with Jesus.
 - The Spirit of God brings peace and confidence concerning eternity.
 - Fear loses its power when believers understand their Covenant with God.
 - Faith looks beyond this life to eternal realities.
- IV. God creates opportunities to minister to others.
 - Kenneth shares several occasions where The LORD opened doors to encourage, comfort and lead people to Christ.
 - Every opportunity to speak to someone is important.
 - The Holy Spirit knows how to connect hurting people who need help with believers.
 - God desires for you to be available and willing.
 - It's possible for one conversation to change a person's eternity.
- V. Fear keeps many believers from sharing their Faith.
 - Many people fail to speak to others about Jesus because of fear.

- Often it is rooted in the fear of rejection or saying the wrong thing.
 - God will help believers say what needs to be said.
 - The Holy Spirit will guide conversations when believers step out in Faith.
 - Fear should never determine whether someone hears the gospel.
 - Boldness comes from trusting God instead of trusting ourselves.
- VI. The WORD of God must remain the final authority.
- Brother Copeland learned early in ministry to follow God's instructions even when it required stepping beyond his comfort zone.
 - Faith requires action.
 - Noah acted on God's instructions before seeing the fulfillment of the promise.
 - As the return of Jesus approaches, believers should expect increasing evidence of God's truth and faithfulness.
 - Continue going back to God's WORD for answers, direction and confidence.

Make It Personal

Every believer will face opportunities to speak up, step out and obey God when it feels uncomfortable. The question is not whether fear will try to stop you; the question is whether you will choose Faith instead.

Ask yourself:

- Is there someone I need to talk to about Jesus?
- Is there an opportunity God has placed before me that I have delayed because of fear?
- What step of obedience is the Holy Spirit prompting me to take?

Pray with us:

Father, thank You for calling me to live by Faith. Help me recognize opportunities to minister to others and give me boldness to obey Your voice. I refuse the fear of rejection, failure or criticism. I trust You to guide my words and direct my steps. Use my life to point people to You. In Jesus' Name I pray. Amen.
